## **Amy Greenbaum to Lead Hillel at Miami University of Ohio**

WASHINGTON, DC (August 2005) – Amy Greenbaum has been named the Executive Director of Hillel at Miami University of Ohio. Greenbaum, an alumna of the university, began her new appointment in July.

In addition to her degree from Miami University, Greenbaum earned a master’s degree in Hebrew letters from Hebrew Union College – Jewish Institute of Religion. She is currently a candidate for rabbinical ordination from HUC-JIR in May 2006.
