The focus will be on building one-on-one relationships with Jewish students while striving to understand their interests, passions, and aspirations and connecting them to opportunities that they may find meaningful. As an Engagement Intern, you must act as a role model, create interactions with students, and follow up authentically, comfortably, and openly.

In addition, you will be a part of a First Year Students of Hillel (FYSH) committee, which will be a hub of innovation for engagement and programming for first-year students. This committee will help to brainstorm and generate ideas for first-year-centric social, learning, and networking events developed and executed by Hillel at Miami staff. Each event should be an engagement tool to attract uninvolved students and advance Jewish values across campus.

- Attend bi-weekly Engagement Intern meetings
